

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF CAGED BIRDS FROM AUSTRALIA INTO THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND

- 1) A health certificate in English signed by a full-time authorized veterinary official of the government of the exporting country stating:-
 - 1.1) number, species, breed, sex and age of the birds,
 - 1.2) identification marks or distinctive colors, animal identification,
 - 1.3) name and address of the owner/exporter and identification of the premises of origin,
 - 1.4) certification of condition items (2) to (7).
- 2) The country of origin is free from Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza in accordance with the current OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code.
- 3) The birds have been resident in the country of origin for not less than 6 (six) weeks or since hatching.
- 4) The birds have been kept on isolation under the supervision of a registered veterinarian for a period of 21 (twenty-one) days prior to shipment.
- 5) The birds have not been vaccinated against Newcastle Disease.
- 6) There has been no clinical signs or other evidence of Newcastle Disease, Fowl Cholera, Duck Virus Enteritis, Duck Virus Hepatitis, Marek's Disease, Avian Infectious Laryngotracheitis, Mycoplasma gallisepticum, Salmonella enteritidis, Salmonella typhimurium, Salmonella pullorum (Pullorum disease), Salmonella gallinarum (Fowl Typhoid), Psittacosis/Ornithosis, Infectious Bursal Disease, Avian Infectious Bronchitis, Avian Tuberculosis and parasitism at the premises of origin for 90 (ninety) days prior to export.
- 7) The birds were tested negative for Salmonellosis by bacterial culture within 21 days of export.
- 8) Failure to follow the import procedures may result in returning the birds to the country of origin or destroying without compensation.
